



## **Week 4: We Are the Church for All People (*All Nations - University City, St. Louis*)**

**Hosts:** Luke and Vicar Jon | **Theme:** Worshiping in Unity as One Body in Christ.

### **Key Scripture Readings:**

#### **Revelation 7:9-10**

*After this I looked, and behold, a great multitude that no one could number, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, clothed in white robes, with palm branches in their hands, and crying out with a loud voice, "Salvation belongs to our God who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb!"*

#### **Colossians 3:11**

*Here there is not Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave, free; but Christ is all, and in all.*

### **Discussion Questions:**

1. How does this passage shape our understanding of the church's diversity?
2. What does it mean to be "one in Christ" while honoring different cultures?
3. What are some ways our church can be more welcoming to people of all backgrounds?
4. Why do some people still feel excluded from the church? How can we change that?

### **Reflection & Application:**

- Write about a time when you felt truly included in a church setting.
- What are three things you can do to make someone feel welcome in your church community?
- How does our worship reflect the unity of God's kingdom?

### **Action Challenge:**

- Intentionally greet or sit with someone you don't know at church this week.
- Learn about a Christian tradition or worship style from another culture.
- Invite someone from a different background to join you for worship or a meal.
